construction team as they target completion in early 2019.

As of mid-October, the roof and walls are up, the sheathing is complete and installation of the the vinyl siding has begun. Three organizations have already participated in helping at the build site. We look forward to the Home Depot team volunteers who will donate their time and materials to help complete the insulation in November.

Then, in January, Home and Garden Television celebrity designers will join the team on site to start on the kitchen and bathroom. The designs of those rooms were created by the winners of a Student Design competition sponsored by NKBA, the National Kitchen and Bath Association.

WHAT HILLS? - WHAT HOPE?

Hope in the Hills Weekend of Hope

Seeking to put God's love into action, Hope in the Hills of Warren brings youth and adults together to restore homes, community, and hope. But what does that really mean? It sounds nice. Everyone wears a purple t-shirt. Things get done. Paint brushes get paint on them....

Hope in the Hills of Warren, a community extension of Warren County Habitat for Humanity, seeks to improve the living conditions of the elderly, low-income and disabled persons in our community. Work is provided at resident owned homes in Washington Boro, Washington Township, Franklin, Mansfield, and Oxford by teams of teenagers and adults, representing many Christian denominations and different community organizations. Each year Hope in the Hills hosts The Weekend of Hope for minor home repairs, and the labor and materials are free to qualifying households. The work is not the heart of the mission, however. After all, it is not called the Weekend of Work.

At the start of the process, volunteer Site Evaluators connect with the homeowners to touch base and make sure they and their jobs are good fits for the project. A lot of what gets done are little jobs — mostly safety related to make it possible for people to stay in their own home a little longer. There are many hills which the homeowners may be struggling to climb themselves. Adding to the struggle is that many homeowners used to be able to do these things for themselves. Some tasks or challenges, however small they may seem to the outside observer, are major obstacles in the eyes of those being served:

The Hills to climb:

- A basement railing, making it safe to go downstairs to do laundry
- Patching an uneven front patio to keep from tripping
- Picking up sticks and tree limbs in the yard from a storm
- Dusting the top shelf or the corners of the ceiling
- Changing smoke detector batteries
- Loneliness, physical decline, loss of independence, financial constraints
- Lack of connection to resources

Mobile Spiritual Leaders who visit the sites on work days to meet with homeowners and team members report that they witness the sadness, almost hopelessness of those who can no longer do the work themselves. Beyond the work that gets done, a transformation begins as homeowners share their joy and thankfulness to have people there to help:

The Hope on the journey:

- The hopefulness of seeing GOOD things happening in their hometown while the news is largely dicouraging .
- Seeing the joy in the hearts of our volunteers gives all of us hope for the future.
- Amazing teens and adults who gladly give up their weekend to help those less fortunate.
- "I thank you from the bottom of my heart... I will be forever grateful and keep you in my prayers."
- Community connections, including the resource directory provided.
- Requests for follow-up with pastors.
- Teens going back to play a game of cards.

The Weekend of Hope often frees the homeowner of the burden of worry regarding the task they requested. As teenagers learn technical skills and engage in social interactions with their neighbors in need, Hope in the Hills continues its mission of building a community where God's love is put into action. "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself." Matthew 22:36-39
