In December, volunteers from Warren Haven and Home Depot, companies who have also financially supported the build, aided in construction at the build site. They worked diligently installing insulation throughout the day and were a great help to our construction crew. ***Progress was made on the new home, as many volunteers helped to further our mission of putting God's love into action to build homes, communities and hope.***

Since adopting an eco-friendlier model in 2007, Rockefeller Center has partnered with Habitat for Humanity Int'l. to reclaim their trees' wood for building materials.




Coming to Washington Township in 2019!
