PROGRESS REPORT: Warren County Habitat for Humanity Community Center



Warren County Habitat for Humanity continues to prepare for opening youth-based community center at 31 Belvidere Avenue in Washington, NJ. The new center will not be just for teenagers, however. We want to be engaging senior citizens and Veterans throughout Warren County, with a focus on improving health, wellness, and finances. Even more valuable is the interaction between generations that can build relationships and friendships.

Youth Programs - Our Community Center will offer both drop-in and structured programs and activities suitable for 5th through 12th graders. Low or no cost activities are

being planned. Parents are encouraged to become involved. They can serve on the Community Center Advisory Committee, lead one-day activities like arts and crafts, or supervise/lead a session-format workshop. Other participation options include helping with fundraising, chaperoning events and field trips, signing up to be tutors in a particular subject or serving as a mentor for job shadowing experiences.



Senior Citizen Programs - Senior programming serves as a gateway to the nation's aging network - connecting older adults to vital community services that help them stay healthy and independent. We will offer programs such as nutrition, health, fitness, wellness, em-



ployment assistance, finance, social and recreational activities, as well as educational and intergenerational programs.



Veteran Programs - Veteran programming will offer an opportunity for all of our armed forces personnel to join together in purposeful discussions and engaging activities to combat the effects of PTSD. We will also offer assistance with resumé creation, career and education exploration, women Veteran discussions, Habitat build days, outlets for counseling, health, wellness, employment assistance and one-on-one talking sessions with peers.

Facility Use - We'll also offer user agreements for renting the facility on Friday nights and weekends for approved activities and performances. Stay tuned for more updates and news about this much needed gathering place in our community! We hope to open our doors in Spring 2021. We simply can't do this without your help.

Catching Up with Our Partner Families - Now that the first two homes of The Patti-Sue Rolak Memorial Build on Beidleman Road are approaching their halfway points, we asked each family some questions about their journey to homeownership.

Rob, Deanna, and Their Three Daughters

Q. How has your experience of working "Sweat Equity Hours" with Habitat been? Were your children able to pitch in, too? "It's an amazing thing to be able to help build our house hands on! I (Deanna) have learned so many things from Dave (a volunteer) - he is a great teacher! Our children have helped at the ReStore. They LOVE volunteering, but they are too young for their hours to count. They love seeing our home being built step by step!"

Q. What has the reaction been from family, friends, and coworkers about this journey you've been on? "Our friends and family are so excited for us! They can't wait for our home to be done so I can host ALL the family and holiday dinners! I can't wait for that part!"



Q. Do you get to choose paint and flooring colors? "We have not gotten to paint so we didn't choose any colors yet, but we got to choose our kitchen cabinets and counter top, roof color and siding color, which I thought was so awesome! We are so happy with the color siding we chose."

Q. You're just about halfway there. Will the upcoming part that leads to completion of your home feel like it's going too quickly, or too slowly? "The beginning seemed to be moving so quickly! Now things have really slowed down. I hope it will move as quickly as the first half!"

Q. In one sentence, what would be the one thing you'd like to tell future Partner Families? "It's a tough and long journey but it's worth it, and you deserve it!"


Q. How has your experience of working "Sweat Equity Hours" with Habitat been? Were your children able to pitch in, too? "It has been rewarding to us to know that we had the opportunity to help with building our house. We will be able to look back at the memories of building our home. It has also been a learning experience for us especially with this being our first home. All the volun-

teers have been great with showing up, giving advice/tips, explaining processes and much more. Unfortunately our kids are too young to pitch in, but their excitement when they see the house is the best."

- **Q.** What has the reaction been from family, friends, and coworkers about this journey you've been on? "They are excited for us because everyone knows how bad we have wanted to become homeowners. Everyone always wants to see pictures of the process. This journey is extra special to my family because my grandmother was so excited to see the end result and was ready to help in any way but she passed away in July. My (Dominique's) grandfather has been volunteering and he really enjoys coming to the build to be a helping hand."
- Q. Do you get to choose paint and flooring colors? Have you figured out where your furniture will go? Have the kids picked out which room they want? "Yes we do get to choose the paint we want. As far as the flooring, both families came up with our top 5 floor colors that we liked. We all agreed on the same flooring and it is beautiful. We can't wait to see it! As far as the furniture, we have an idea, but its hard to picture it at this stage. I'm already decorating our house in my head for sure! I love being crafty and making things, so we will see what I come up with. The boys haven't picked out a room yet but they definitely will soon. They are getting bunk beds so our one son wants a blue bed."
- Q. You're just about halfway there. Will the upcoming part that leads to completion of your home feel like it's going too quickly, or too slowly? "We both feel that it is going to be fast and before we know it we are going to be in our new home."

Warren County Habitat for Humanity Receives Three Generous Grants

Last year was not an easy time to apply for grants and other funding. Many of our reliable sources weren't even accepting applications due to understaffing and underfunding. Accordingly, we are tremendously grateful for the three grants received so far this year.



In early February of this year, we received \$2,500 from **The Lillian Schenck Charitable Trust**, administered by PNC Bank. These funds will support The Patti-Sue Rolak Memorial Build on Beidleman Road and help us finish up the first two homes there.

In January, **Lowe's** awarded \$5,000 to our affiliate to the March 8th - 15th International Women Build Week program, a partnership between Habitat International and Lowe's Corporate. The purpose of the event is to unite women and spotlight their need for safe and affordable housing through home builds and repairs during this week. Stay tuned!



- 3. Must have the ability to pay (make payments on a mortgage).


